

# KIHEI KAI NANI ISLAND EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION – PLEASE REVIEW IMMEDIATELY!

## WATCH

### A “WATCH” IS IN EFFECT

Emergencies bring about TWO phases of notification. A WATCH and then a WARNING. A “WATCH” means CONDITIONS ARE BEING MONITORED AND COULD AFFECT US WITHIN HOURS. During a “WATCH” phase begin planning for an evacuation. Keep in mind the “WATCH” may be cancelled.

When the time comes, if you choose NOT TO LEAVE you will be asked by staff to sign a waiver that you were given notice of this emergency.

## PREPARATION

### IF YOU EVACUATE TAKE:

1. 1 gal Water pp.
2. Prescriptions
3. Clothes 3-4 days.
4. Cash
5. Flashlights
6. Batteries
7. Radios
8. Food for 3 days
9. Blankets/Pillows
10. Toilet Paper (2pp)
11. Personal items
12. Cell Phones
13. LOCK UP
14. TAKE KEYS
15. Call Family

## WARNING

When a “WARNING” is activated CONDITIONS ARE EXPECTED WITHIN 3 HOURS. Monitor Radio or TV Stations for updated information. This phase will be accompanied by our County Emergency Siren System. Guests and Owners should follow the evacuation plan as follows:

## EVACUATE:

### FOUR EVACUATION SITES

#### PI’ILANI ROAD LOCATIONS

**Hope Chapel** – L on Welakahao  
**Elleair Golf Course** – R on Lipoa  
**Business Park** – R on Lipoa E  
**KLC Lutheran Ch** – R on Moi Pl  
**Have Restroom (RR) Facilities**

Go to **ALANUI KE ALI’I**  
**Turn R (by Chevron)**

Go up hill to **PIILANI HWY:**  
**Turn L**

Go to Welakahao  
**Turn L to Hope Chapel**

Go to **LIPOA ST (3 lights)**  
**Turn R**  
**Elleair Golf Course on R**  
**Business Park Further E**  
Go to **MOI Place (after 5<sup>th</sup> light)**  
**Kihei Luther Church R**

**DO NOT LEAVE THIS AREA UNTIL AN ALL-CLEAR HAS BEEN ANNOUNCED.**

## MAUI EMERGENCIES

### TSUNAMI’S

A Tsunami can occur without warning but generally are generated from a major earthquake. A Tsunami is a large body of water that is stirred up in the ocean as earthquake fault plates are activated and it can build or diminish as it travels across the ocean. NOAA has buoy’s in the Ocean in various areas to notify us of an impending Tsunami. Staff will implement our response plan.

### HURRICANES

Hurricanes are winds in excess of 80mph that develop in the Pacific Ocean off Mexico. It can take 3-5 days to reach Hawaii. As it approaches NOAA and Civil Defense monitors its progress and will activate a WATCH. KKN staff will implement our response plan at that time.

### EARTHQUAKES

Earthquakes occur with no warning. Depending on its location, staff will evacuate everyone to higher ground just in case a tsunami has been generated. If it is not nearby, Civil Defense will activate a “WATCH” and KKN staff will implement our response plan.

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
