President's Message

During the past year, we have been busy upgrading the property and trying to prevent water damage in our units by completing our High-Risk Inspection this year and replacing common element plumbing when a unit is remodeled.

During the inspection, the plumber inspected all the water features in each unit and notified the owners of items that needed to be repaired.

Since the inspection, we have had very few complaints about leaking water features. Just a reminder: if your water heater is 10 years or older please consider replacing it because if it leaks and causes considerable damage covered by our casualty insurance, the premium becomes the single most expensive cost in our budget.

Laundry/Office Roof Replacement

Our Laundry/Office roof must be replaced due to the serious termite infestation. You will be receiving a ballot from the Association with full details. We must have 67% owner's approval to proceed. There will be NO additional costs to owners. The funds are already in our reserves. Please sign the ballot when it comes and return to DMI ASAP so we can get on with the work!

The Board has asked for estimates from contractors and we are planning to replace the roof in the months of August and September of this year 2020.

New Stairway





The instant installed stairs in the hill by building #6 were not built to code so the Board of Directors elected to remove the stepping stone steps and replaced it with a cement stairway to bring it up to code with two handrails.

We had 2"x2" sheets of pavers installed along the lanai side of building #13, and this will help keep the mud down and the grass will grow between the pavers and look really nice. As of now, it's doing well. We are also planning the installation of the 2'x2' sheets of pavers behind building #12. We have them on order now.





Landscaping Committee

Board Member Pat Hoskin is in charge of the Landscaping Committee and working with Island Plant and keeping the property looking at its best. The jacaranda trees need some looking after and we will have an arborist perform an analysis on those.

The simple yet elegant beauty of the Hibiscus flower says "Hawaii." In fact, the yellow Hibiscus is the Hawaii state flower. Hawaii changed its state flower from the native red hibiscus (Hibiscus kokio), on June 6, 1988, to the Hawaiian hibiscus - ma'o hau hele, the only species of yellow hibiscus. Blooms only last about a day and the plant blooms from spring through early summer with occasional flowers during the rest of the year.

Homeowner Reminders for the New Year

- Check the batteries in your smoke detector & your water moisture sensor with your water heater. If your water heater is over 10 yrs old you may want to get it replaced.
- Homeowners with an Electronic Lock Box on their front door check your batteries.
- Please turn into the front office your proof of Insurance so that we may have it on file. This should be done every year.
- If you are going to remodel your unit, please let us know and get it approved with the Board of Directors.
- If you have a bicycle on the property, make sure it is registered and we have it on file. There are many bikes without registration that have been sitting for some time. (rusting) We will be sending out 48 hours notices soon to owners without this information on file. If not received your bike may be taken off the property.
- Have your guest check into the office to obtain their parking pass.

Site Manager's Report July – October 2019

Projects and Repairs on the Property

- Purchased 2 new Large commercial electric dryers and 1 stack smaller electric dryer.
- Plumbing repairs we have done in units, 232,222, and 122.
- Replaced the planter boxes around the pool wall and smoking areas.
- Added new handrails to the stairs behind building #6 to bring up to code.
- The shower trees on the entry drive have all been trimmed.
- We added 3 large palms along the fence line behind building #9.
- Started trimming the large trees behind all the buildings on the south side of the property.
- The driveway speed bumps have new stripes.
- All stairways have been cleaned. (ongoing)
- The pathway stairs have been painted with yellow sand paint for none slip.
- Added plants to the front of building #6.
- There was an electrical upgrade to the laundry room and office building.
- The lower foot shower actuator has been rebuilt
