We had a very remarkable workday on Monday with about 19 vols. In fact it was probably one of the best Monday workdays we have ever experienced. The group was very focused and every project was not only handled with great care but the attitude was so supportive and upbeat, it was remarkable.

February 3 Workday Projects...

We had a variety of projects that were handled:

- One group began the process of cutting out a naupaka patch that had to be removed for the upcoming sand delivery. (Starting date is Feb. 10, next Monday!)
- Another group protected the pohuehue dune plants that will be salvaged during the sand project. Those plants will be the surviving start plants for the next phase.
- Another group began to install the post and rope fencing that will alert the contractor of the exact boundaries for the sand infill project.
- Our special-teams group was working to harvest small pohuehue seeds that will be delivered to the plant company that is propagating our new pohuehue plants. Very important project.
- Another team began to trim back or cut back any invasive vegetation that will be in the way of the contractor or public at the termination of this 10 day infill project.

What a great and hard working volunteer family. This work is so much appreciated not just by us but all on the Maui County side. Excellent!











Missed the turn...

You may have heard that a car with two passengers tried out our ADA ramp at Kamaole 1 on late Sunday evening and found it lacking. No beach access after all, but very close. All kidding aside, it seems that they proceeded down Ke Ali'i Alanui and kept right on going, missing the turn onto South Kihei Road and instead plowing right through the beach parking lot and then onto the ADA pedestrian ramp. The ramp sustained a lot of damage but glad to report that the two ladies are not seriously injured.
